This Day begins with strong Trades and rugged Sea gained the U.C. small at 4:30 P.M. raised a small school of small Whales covered and chased but got no chance on account of darkness Boats came aboard after Dark Middle Part - strong Trades latter Part - strong Trades and very rugged Sea. Walter Nichols and Joe Gibbon the same Crew engaged at general work so ends this Day

This Day begins with strong Trades and rugged Sea Vessel on the northern Tack Middle Part - strong Trades latter Part - strong Trades and rugged Sea saw several Sails Island South saw Porpoises Walter Nichols better Joe Gibbon's sickness developed into General and is no better Crew engaged at general work so ends this Day
