a large number of small Fish
around the Vessel saw several
large Schools of Porpoises
Middle part - fine Weather with
moderate Trades latter part -
fine clear Weather and moderate
Trades Vessel on the Northern Tack
saw several schools of Porpoises
and one School of Black Fish
plenty of small Fish around the
Vessel Crew employed at general Work
so ends this Day

Monday December 31st

This Day begins with moderate
Trades Vessel's Head West - Lat West
Middle part fine Weather latter
part - saw fine Weather saw large
White Water 4 miles away but saw
nothing more of it. Vessel's Head
West - South - West - saw several Sails
found South Crew employed at
general Work so ends this Day

This Day begins with fresh Trades
and rugged Sea Vessel Heading
to the Westward Middle part - fresh
Trades latter part - strong Trades and
rugged Sea Vessel's Head to the South
and West - Crew employed at general
Work so ends this Day

Thursday January 3rd

This Day begins with strong Trades
and rugged Sea saw several
Sails found South Middle part
strong Trades latter part - strong
Trades and rugged Sea Vessel's Head
to the North and West - Crew employed
at general Work so ends this Day

Friday January 4th

This Day begins with fresh Trades
and rugged Sea saw a School of
Killer Middle part - strong Trades
latter part - strong Trades with
heavy Sea Vessel on the Northern
Tack Crew engaged at general
