This Day begins with moderate Trades saw several Sails broad West saw one schooner at anchor supposed it was the Antarctic and sundown took in Sail and hauled to the Wind on off Shore Tack Middle part Calm latter part light North Winds with Rain so ends this Day

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Monday March 11th

This Day begins with strong Trades and Rain Squalls saw several Sails Middle part strong Trades Vessel heading North latter part more moderate Trades Raised the South East end of Cuba Crew employed at general Work so ends this Day

Tuesday March 12th

This Day begins with fresh Trades Vessel's Head West North West - We Deemed off Duty with General M^r North off Duty with a Fever. Middle part fresh Trades latter part fresh Trades Vessel going to Leeward along the Land Crew engaged getting out Provisions so ends this Day

Wednesday March 13th

This Day begins with fresh Trades Vessel running along the Land at Sundown Raised Cape de Cruz Light shortened Sail and luffed to the Wind on the off shore Tack Middle part strong Trades latter part moderate Trades Vessel under all Sail heading North Crew engaged at general Work so ends this Day
