Tuesday March 26th

This Day begins with fresh North West Wind Vessel on Northern Tack under all Sail saw several Sail Wrecked to the Northward at Sundown Tacked and off Shore and shortened Sail for the Night Middle part light Winds latter part light baffling Wind tacked and stood in shore raised the Cays and saw a large Wreck high and dry saw Grampus Wreck around heading off Shore Crew engaged at general Work Mr. Hulchinson returned to duty Joe Seneca better so ends this Day

Wednesday March 27th

This Day begins with light baffling Winds Vessel headed off shore Middle part light North Winds latter part Calm sent in the Jib and started to repair it saw Black fish and several Sails Joe Seneca the same so ends this Day

Thursday March 28th

This Day begins with a calm finished repairing the Jib and vent. At again saw 2 Sails Middle part light North Wind latter part light North North East Wind Vessel under all Sail on the Northern Tack saw several schools of Porpoises and several Sails Joe Seneca the same Crew engaged at general Work so ends this Day

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Friday March 29th

This Day begins with fresh Breeze from the Northward saw several Sails Vessel under all Sail on the Western Tack and Sundown shortened Sail for the Night saw a large White Water 6 miles to Windward but saw nothing more Middle part fresh Trades latter part fresh Trades made all Sail Vessel on the Northern Tack Crew engaged at general Work so ends this Day

Saturday March 30th

This Day begins with fresh Trades Vessel on the Northern Tack saw several Sails bound to the Eastward Water Verry full of fish Middle part moderate Trades Vessel on Northern Tack latter part light Trades Wind hauling to the Eastward Vessel on the Northern Tack saw several Sails Joe Seneca the same Mr. Worth off duty Sick Crew engaged at general Work so ends this Day

Sunday March 31st

This Day begins with strong North Wind hauling to the Eastward Vessel on the Northern Tack saw several Sails Middle part strong Wind latter part strong Breeze from the Eastward Vessel on the Northern Tack Mr. Worth and Joe Seneca the same so ends this Day
