Tuesday April 16th

This day begins with fine clear weather with westerly wind vessel on southerly tack engaged boiling out the body middle part strong winds and calms with rain squalls with good deal of sea engaged sailing latter part calms and light north west winds vessel on the northerly tack finished boiling the body at 12 M M^o Worth no better so ends this day

Wednesday April 17th

This day begins with fresh wind from the north west vessel on the northerly tack stowed down all the oil and stowed off the hole middle part strong north wind and rugged sea latter part more moderate and sea going down M^o Worth the same saw several sails crew engaged cleaning ship so ends this day

Thursday April 18th

This day begins with moderate north wind and smooth water saw several sails middle part squally latter part moderate weather and smooth water M^o Worth the same crew engaged at general work so ends this day

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Friday April 19th

This day begins with light northerly winds and smooth water at 3 P.M. raised a large lone sperm whale about 4 miles to leeward at 4 P.M. lowered all the boats the waist boat in charge of the Capt. starboard boat went on and fastened solid at sundown the starboard boat struck second boat the mate killed the whale with a bomb got him fast alongside at 7:30 P.M. and set the watches at 8 P.M. middle part calms latter part called all hands at 3:30 A.M. broke out provisions and got up the cutting gear and started to cut at 4 A.M. got the head off so ends this day M^o Worth the same

Saturday April 20th

This day begins with a calm all hands engaged cutting the whale got the body all in made everything fast set the watches at 4 P.M. middle part at 9 P.M. started the hog works and commenced to boil the body latter part cooled down and started to cut the head got the punk in M^o Worth latter so ends this day
