Saturday April 27th

This Day begins with strong Gale from the North West - Vessel Hove too on Port Tack under Main Tressail and Fore Staysail Middle part Gale from North West - Latter part Gale from North West - with Wind hauling to the Westward wore around on Starboard Tack Vessel Hove too under Tressail and Fore Staysail Noth Worth improving so ends this Day

Sunday April 28th

This Day begins with Gale from the Westward Vessel Hove too on Starboard Tack saw 2 sails Middle part moderating slightly Latter part strong Breeze from the Westward with rugged sea made some sail and stood along on southern Tack. Noth Worth slowly improving so ends this Day

Monday April 29th

This Day begins with strong Breeze from the Westward Vessel on the Southern Tack Middle part more moderate Latter part light Breeze from the Westward Vessel on the Southern Tack broke out the other Foresail and started to Repair it cut up the Old one Noth Worth better so ends this Day

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Tuesday April 30th

This Day begins with light North West Winds with considerable Sea finished repairing the Foresail and bent it Middle part very light West Winds Latter part light West Wind Vessel on the Northern Tack engaged patching the sheathing and at general Work Noth Worth much better so ends this Day

Wednesday May 1st

This Day begins with light Westerly Winds Vessel on the Northern Tack at sundown shortened Sail for the night Middle part light Weather at 11 P.M. got a good Breeze from the Southard Latter part light Breeze from the Southard Vessel under all Sail heading West South West - Crew employed at general Work Noth Worth returned to Duty so ends this Day

Thursday May 2nd

This Day begins with light Winds from the Southard Vessel on the Western Tack at sundown shortened Sail for the night Middle part Calms Latter part light Wind from the Southard and Westward Vessel under all sail on the Western Tack Crew employed at general Work caught a Porpoise so ends this Day
