Monday June 3rd

This Day begins with Wind from the Southward Rainy and squally very rugged Vessel on the Eastern Tack Middle part more moderate latter part southerly Wind and very rugged sail one sail bound North Vessel on the Eastern Tack No Ogduis Leg a good deal better crew employed at general Work so ends this Day

Tuesday June 4th

This Day begins with strong southerly Wind and very rugged Sea a few small Fishes abound the Vessel on the Eastern Tack at sundown shortened sail for the night Middle part Wind moderated and hauled to the Westward latter part light Westerly Wind Vessel's Head North East Mate returned to Duty saw Crabs and one sail crew engaged scraping spars and cleaning Iron Work Sea moderate so ends this Day

Wednesday June 5th

This Day begins with light West Winds Vessel's Head North North East saw one Steamship at sundown shortened sail for the night Middle part light South Winds latter part strong southerly Winds Vessel's Head North and very rugged and squally saw one Whaling Schooner called "The Rising Sun" so ends this Day
Lat 34°58 North Long 75°01 West

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Thursday June 6th

This Day begins with heavy squally Weather from the Southward later the Wind hauled to the Westward and moderated a little Vessel's Head North Middle part moderate West Wind Vessel on the Northern Tack latter part light northerly Winds Vessel on the Northern Tack saw one Whaling Schooner bound North saw several other sails crew employed at tarring and cleaning Iron Work so ends this Day

Friday June 7th

This Day begins with moderate North Winds Vessel on the Western Tack at sundown shortened sail and Wore around on the Eastern Tack saw several sails Middle part light variable Winds latter part light northerly Winds varying to the Eastward Vessel's Head North West saw several sails crew employed scraping masts so ends this Day

Saturday June 8th

This Day begins with light Winds from North East Vessel's Head North West at sundown shortened sail for the night Middle part Calms and light Winds from South West latter part light South West Winds Vessel's Head North West engaged paint Iron Work and breaking out provisions so ends this Day
