Sunday June 9th

This Day begins with light South West Winds Vessel on the Western tack saw several large schools of Grampus Porpoise and Black Fish at sundown shortened sail for the night latter part light South West Winds at 10 P.M. were arrived on the Eastern tack latter part fresh breezes from South West and quite happy and rugged so ends this day

Monday June 10th

This Day begins with fresh breezes from South West Vessel on the Eastern tack saw several sails and a great many Porpoises middle part more moderate latter part fresh breezes from the South West and quite rugged. at Vessel on the Northern tack at 7 A.M. raised a school of mixed Whales at 8 A.M. lowered the Starboard Boat in charge of the 1st Mate and the Waist Boat the Starboard Boat went on at once and fastened solid Whale did not gain got the Whale spouting good blood and the Waist Boat struck same Whale the Starboard Boat got badly stove in trying to lance the Whale the Waist Boat brought the Whale alongside at 10 A.M. got up the cutting gear and got all ready to cut so ends this Day

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Monday June 11th

This Day begins with all hands engaged cutting the Whale got him all cut in at 4 P.M. and kept the Vessel off North by West with southerly Wind cleared away the Head and set the Hatches at 7 P.M. middle part fine Weather with southerly Wind Vessels Head North by West. Started the Try Works at 11 P.M. latter part engaged boiling. South West Winds Vessels Head North by West so ends this Day

Tuesday June 12th

This Day begins with light South West Winds Vessels Head North engaged boiling the Whale and stowing down the Head Oil middle part fine Weather with South West Winds finished boiling at 10 P.M. latter part South West Wind and Foggy Vessels Head North by East stowed down the Oil and scrubbed the Vessel took up the Starboard Deck sheathing so ends this Day

Wednesday June 13th

This Day begins with Fog and light South West Winds at 2 P.M. Wind hauled to North West and Fog cleared away Vessels Head North East by North middle part Rainy and Squally latter part Fog latter cleared up spoke a Fishing Schooner told us Course and distance to Block Island got Coal Oil from him Wind from the Westward Vessels Head North North East so ends this Day
