the Watchers employed in fitting the rigging & C

These 24 hours Comes with Pleasant breeze from
the North and Pleasant Weather better than last week
with rain N.N.W. N.N.

Remarks on Board Friday January the 15th 1841
These 24 hours Comes with thick with rain
middle and latter part Pleasant breeze and
Clear Weather Steaming S.W. & C

Lat 27° 30' South

Remarks on Board Saturday January the 16th 1841
These 24 hours Comes with stiff breeze from the S.W.
took in Steaming Sails and top gallant Sails at 10
P.M. the Wind held to West Saw a Bank Ship
Steaming South & C Lat 31° 45' South

Remarks on Board Sunday January the 17th 1841
These 24 hours Comes with a stiff breeze
from the South at 6 P.M. Sailed Ship to the
W.S.W. & M. Wind held S & Steaming S.W.
Lat 34° 30' South Sailed a Brig Steaming
S.W. & C Lat 32° 55' South
Long 44° 50' West

Remarks on Board Monday January the 18th
These 24 hours Comes with light Winds from the
S.W. & Steaming S.W. the Watchers employed in mending all
muzzles top sails and top gallant Sails & C
Lat 34° 15' South Long 48° 50' West

Remarks on Board Tuesday January the 19th 1841
These 24 hours light Breeze from the S.W. & E
and Pleasant Weather at 6 P.M. Spoke the Bank
Minerva of New Bedford 280 Tons 7 months sight
took in top gallant Sails Steaming West &
daylight made Sails Steaming to the S.W. & S
Strong Brig Standing S employed in fitting
the rigging & C Lat 34° 45' South
