

Ship Hector. Lying in Tumbes. 1841

Sunday October 10th 1841

Commences with a light breeze. And cloudy. Employed in getting wood and water. brought off a raft of water. A.M. pleasant. all hands on a stroll ashore. Ends this 24 hours. Vinted aboard.

Monday Oct 11th 1841

Cloudy weather. All hands at leisure. Sunset the rain returned. A.M. Employed in rafting off wood and water. This Ends this 24 hours.

Tuesday Oct 12th 1841

Light breeze and cloudy. All hands employed in getting wood and water. 3 or 4 ships arrived from party. I am lying here at anchor. A.M. busy in getting water. A light breeze of wind. So Ends

Wednesday Oct 13th 1841

A strong breeze. Employed in getting wood and water. 2 or 3 of the crew down sick. which comes unhandy. A.M. The Capt unwell. Busy at work ashore. rafting off water. So Ends

Thursday Oct 14th

Fresh breeze. Hard at work in getting wood and water. A.M. got off the last raft of water. The Bark alto. just arrived. from party. So Ends this hour

Friday Oct 15th

Indifferent fine weather. Employed in taking on board wood and stowing it away. Toward ashore a small raft of water to be filled. The ship I.C. Richmond. just from home. arrived. with 30 lbs. 2 or 3 of the crew sick and off duty. So Ends.

Saturday Oct 16th 1841

Thick 24 hours. commences with fine weather. Employed in stowing wood and water. Mr. Hazard ashore cutting wood. So Ends this 24 hours. Naval

Sunday Oct 17th 1841

Light air. Weather fine. The barboard water on Liberty. Sunset the water returned. The sick ones recovering. So Ends this 24 hours. Liberty -

Monday Oct 18th

Commences with light air. Daylight moderate breezes from the sea board. 9 A.M. weighed anchor and stood out to sea. Wind fair. So Ends

Tuesday Oct 19th

Commences with fine breezes. Employed in stowing wood in the fore hold. A.M. Employed in ship's duty. nothing in sight. So Ends this 24 hours

Wednesday Oct 20th

Commences with a fine breeze. Employed in breaking out in the after hold after rice. A.M. pleasant. Fresh breezes. nothing in sight. So Ends this 24 hours

Thursday October 21st

quite pleasant. weather. Employed in ship's duty. nothing in sight. much part blowing fresh. A.M. Cloudy weather. and some sailing. 7 A.M. Lowered after blackfish. Larboard boat fastened the iron drawn. The boat returned and made sail on the ship. steering by the wind west. So Ends this 24 hours
