Light breezes and pleasant. Employed in mending the waist boat. A.M. Employed in cocaking out in the main hatchway. To Cooper the Oil. Thus ends this 24 hours.

Saturday November 23rd

Light winds and cloudy. hard at work in Coopering the Oil. 6 P.M. raised a school of sperm whales. 3 miles to windward, pushed up there as soon as possible. The laborers succeeded in fastening. A.M. commenced cutting. 9 A.M. finished. steering by the wind.

Sunday Nov 24th

Employed in boiling and Coopering the Oil. Middle parts standing half watches. A.M. Cooked down. So ends this 24 hours.

Monday Oct 25th

Light breezes. Employed in Coopering the Oil in main hatchway. Ship heading to the Eastward under double reefed topsails. Finbacks in sight.

Tuesday Nov 26th

Clear weather and pleasant trades. Employed in Coopering the Oil in the main hatchway. Middle parts blowing strong. A.M. The same kind of weather.

Light breezes, fine trades. Ship standing to the Eastward under double reefed topsails. Employed in Coopering the Oil. Lat 3.33 South

Pleasant and fine breezes. Coopering the Oil in the main hatchway. Middle parts standing 4 watches. A.M. Fine weather. Nothing in sight. So ends this 24 hours.

A.M. Fine weather. At work in the main hold. Sunset squally. The yards, steering N.W. West A.M. Commenced with fine trades and fine weather. Coopering the Oil. Thus ends this day.

Saturday Oct 30th

Fine pleasant weather. Employed in Coopering the Oil. Latte parts. nothing in sight. Employed in Coopering. Thus ends this day.

Lat 2.21 South

Long 90.06 West

Sunday Oct 31st

Pleasant weather and a fine wind. busy at work in the main hold. steering N.W. West. Latte parts. crew at leisure in reading. raised some of the gallapagos islands. Thus ends this 24 hours.

Monday Oct 32nd (Nov 1)

Pleasant weather. The crew at leisure in reading. Sunset spoke the ship Roman Smith. 27 mo. 2500 spm. 3 more ships to the leeward. A.M. pleasant. Lowered 2 boats to go a trypsin. 10 A.M. the ships to the leeward raised whales. The Bodman got on whale. So ends this day.

Tuesday Nov 2nd

Stormy and pleasant weather. 2 boats ashore after trypsin. 9 P.M. the boats returned. with some trypsin.
