

Sector laying in Callao in 1842

Monday May 2<sup>d</sup> 1842

Fine breeze and clear weather. 4 P.M. Opened the harbor of Callao. Beating up. 6.30 came to anchor in 15 fathoms water, muddy bottom. Latter part one watch on liberty. Ship's Junior 7 mos 350 lbs. Hope 24 mos 1200 (Wm & Henry) 5 mos 90 lbs. And the English Bark Kingsdown Liverpool all are lying here at anchor. So ends.

Tuesday May 3<sup>d</sup>

Wilmington Liverpool packet, arrived 4 mos 30 lbs. Middle and latter parts fine. Latter part watch on liberty. So ends these hours.

Wednesday May 4<sup>th</sup>

Calm weather. Not much doing on board. Latter part watch on liberty. Sunset. all returned well at sundown. So ends.

Thursday May 5<sup>th</sup>

Took off some sweet potatoes and shipped some men. At daylight have short. Latter part. Calm. Ends these hours.

Friday May 6<sup>th</sup>

Ship adeline Gibbs arrived 8 mos 350 lbs. Also Bark Henry 70 lbs to P.M. put to sea for pata. Course N.W. Latter part the same. Lat 12 04 South. Long 79 13 West.

Towards pata. Gray Commander

Saturday May 7<sup>th</sup> 1842

Commenced with light trades from S.E. Course N.W. 4 P.M. washed off the decks as usual. Latter part fine. Caught a blackfish. Ends these 24 hours.

Lat 11.23 South  
Long 80.06 West.

Sunday May 8<sup>th</sup>

Fine trades from S.E. and clear weather. Saw Blackfish and one sword fish. 6 P.M. took in fore and main top gallant sail & blew down the main topsail. Latter part fine. Nothing seen worthy of note. So ends these hours.

Lat 10.25 South  
Long 81.30 West.

Monday May 9<sup>th</sup>

Fresh winds from S.E. and pleasant weather. Ship's Course North. shifted the studding sails. Middle and latter parts the same. Saw Blackfish. Ends these 24 hours.

Lat 7.40 South  
Long West.

Tuesday May 10<sup>th</sup>

Light trades from S.E. and clear weather. Saw a Bark Chasing Blackfish. Latter part fine. Steering N.W. Employed in breaking out for water. Saw no

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
