

Galapagos Islands.

Monday May 1st 1843.

Monday May 2nd 1842.
Came with light breezes and pleasant weather; Lee portpoises and finbacks
latter part, boiling, at 12 m. Spoke Barque Livant, Rickell, of F.H. Warch.
5 1/2 m. out 80 bbls; she reported having spoken on the 25th of April in Lee
Bay, the ship Wm. West of F.H. with 80 bbls. a m. Standing in, stowed
the anchors and unbent the chain.

Tuesday May 2nd

Commenced with fresh trade: running down for Marlborough, saw a school of
Sperm whales. Struck and killed two, hauled at 5-30 p.m. and took them
alongside at 8-30. A.M. cut them in, braced full standing in shore and
commenced boiling at noon off the island of Marlborough, saw porpoises &c.



Wednesday May 3rd

Begin with moderate trades and cloudy weather; Employed in boiling; at 4 p.m. tackled off shore; a.m. finished boiling and stowed off the run; one Ship in sight.

Thursday May 4th.

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 Boms with moderate fine weather, washed off, at 4 p.m. spoke ship Eliza
 L.B. Penney, church of Fairhaven 5 mas out 80 bbls

Friday May 5th.

Commenced with fresh trades; off weather bay; took letters re. four ships in sight; made some sizing stuff. Sat 20. 1775.

Saturday May 6th

Begin the same; three ships in sight. Spoke Ship Kupfield, Reg. of Dartmouth
17 mas out with 800 bbls, who reported having spoken March 19th Ship
C. M. Morgan with 1150 bbls, aurora of Nictt 900 bbls, Magnolia 130 bbls
and April 5 Barque Earland of N.B. with 150 bbls, Ship Thule of Nictt
300 bbls and May 14th Ship David Paddock, Ship of Nanttt 18 mas out
with 570 bbls, who reported having spoken May 1st. Ship Archer with 10500
New 600 bbls, and Ship Morse 600 bbls; Saw four fish; "wet holes; at noon off
Rock Rodando: One ship in sight.
