Remained with light and fair. at 3 p. m. A strong wind at 4-50 weather dark with thunder and lightning. took in everything but the top shell; at 6 made fair again. fair weather, down rain. latter part dark. Cal by one 5 p. m. long by one 9 p. m.

Downy with field mites and other insects. at 4 p.m. took in form of the
light blue. mites but their numbers at 3 a.m. would reach the stage
further the mites and yet. at by the 3 p.m. long by 2 and 9 p.m.

Monday June 19th

Kept with moderate breeze and hazy weather. Turned out the masts
and set the fore top-mast during the night. Masted & set the fore
gold and silver, carried away the fore top-mast during the night
and hauled. Sailed to the wind and hauled with ease. Sailed on the
11th. Longitude 98° 08' W.

Monday June 13th

Domonard with fresh gold and equally, carried away the main veins
ward. Middle and latter parts very equally with rain, left in main top
gallard tail, pit, and fore top mud. During this descent found latdy
in drake addition 14000 s. long by 6000 w.

February 19th.

Sunday June 1st
 Commenced with strong breeze from the S. and heavy weather, and
 a remarkable number of birds. Took in the morning the greatest part
 and reached the top of the at 9 am. Took rain and lightning,
 how the water caught in the main, took rain and lightning,
 at 2 am. At the morning took rain and lightning, at 8 am. At
 about noon, took the rain, took rain and lightning,

Sunday June 18th.

12 mi. with strong gale and squally, took in the fore part for
about 10 mi. to the falls, a heavy sea running and very irregular

Monday June 19th

From with moderate calm a fair cloudy with a haze

Commenced with fresh galls with three and four infestations
