

London May 25th 1843

I had with a few days from the 10th. At night down raining off hard & our
 feet wet & gallant till and night. During the latter part night being from
 the 10th to 13th. Subsequent to the 11th.

Monday May 28th
Commenced with light easterly wind, and pleasant weather, blowing to the
W. with all sail out. Very much cooler, as we had a new main top sail
set 200 yds. Long 111000 ft.

At Valley May 3rd.
 Arrived with fine breeze from the N.W. and fair weather. About four
 o'clock, sent a messenger to go and tell, and returning said. a.m.
 that the same report of new line line. Lat 33° 03' 35". Long 110° 30' W.

Mercator gave the wind with increasing length the quality. 2. m. still under the fore. - 3. 30. 37. 50.

Commenced with Henry Galt and the d.d.m. and studying, by the

W. L. Sat 3.40 PM.
