

Remarks On Board Bark

Friday December 10th 1869
at 2 O'clock I left
morit Lait and cast off
our pass at the wharf
and the Pilot took us out side
of the reef at half past
2 O'clock the Pilot left us and
we steered S by E by E and have
got 33 men in all 20 Kanakas
and 13 white men
so ends this day

And God
be praised we are all in good
health

Sunday December 16th
we got a finer observation
to day fine weather heading
S the watch at all setting
height deck reading 40 we are
bound to the Marquesas but
have got a hard wind but I
will try with the help of God
to be contented with the winds
and take them as our heavenly
father sees fit to give them to
us thank God we are all
in good health and I
do feel willing to thank
our Heavenly Father and to
try to live a better life and may
I please God to remember
my poor absent Wife and
Children.
