5						Refused to get the anchor called them left asked them their names	
6						some said they had only shipped for 2 months and then that had shipped for 3 months	
7						and that whaling and later on working ship	
8						Reasons the Capt. after trying to Reason with them they still refused to work put them in Irons and made them fast read the ship's articles in the presence of all the crew offering them another opportunity to turn to which they refused Roger Carbery making a threat that if the Capt. ever laid the hands off his hands he would kill him in two minutes after	
9						after being in Irons about one hour all concluded to return to duty Capt. Carbery Williams and Fitzsimmons have us Starboard anchor broke one of the main block Nippers wire hauled again to S. by E. with squalls of Rain
