Cobbin just Arrived on the Bank the Middle and Last part fresh gales and rainy weather at 10 A.M. put the lines out at noon got the Trawling work to going Depth of water fathoms No observation

October 29
1817
This 24 hours Begins with fresh gales and rainy weather See to plenty of Black fish at 8 p.m. put out the lines at noon made to five and got the Trawling work to going Depth of water 46 fathoms

Thursday
October 30
1817
This 24 hours Begins with moderate weather and closed the Middle and Last part moderate gales and pleasant weather all hands Employed in Stowing down Oil See End this Depth of water 47 fathoms

Friday
October 31
1817
This 24 hours Begins with pleasant weather at 6 p.m. See whales this 24 hours Ends with pleasant weather 50 fathoms of water Lat 40 20

Saturday
November 1
1817
This 24 hours begins with light winds and pleasant weather See to plenty of whales put out after them but could not strike within 24 hours with pleasant weather 49 fathoms of water Lat 40 14

Remarks on board
Sunday
November 2
1817
This 24 hours Begins with light winds and pleasant weather at 2 p.m. See whales put out after them and Struck and She ran too windward we haled her and got her along side at 12 o'clock at night at 4 A.M. began to cut her in at 10 got the lines to going So Ends this with pleasant weather Depth of water 50 fathoms Lat 40 20

November 3
1817
This 24 hours Begins with fresh gales and pleasant weather the Middle and Last part the same See to plenty of whales but did not put off after them Depth of water 48 fathoms Lat 40 18

Remarks on board
Tuesday
November 4
1817
All this 24 hours fresh gales and pleasant weather See whales but did not put off after them the weather being very rough Depth of water 42 fathoms Lat

Wednesday
November 5
1817
This 24 hours Begins with fresh gales and pleasant weather at 4 p.m. finished Trawling the Middle part the same the Last part light winds and closed weather all hands Employed in Stowing down Depth of water 48 fathoms
