Thursday November 10
1817

gales at 4 P.M. put the west
boat on the Cranes See whale
going fast to windward the last
part moderate S.W. wind and
fog in making land Lat 40..30

1817

winds and pleasant weather See
one sail standing to the westward
spoke the ship golden Pinner
the last part of this 24 hours
moderate weather Depth of water 62
fathoms So Ends this Lat 40..00

1817
This 24 hours Begins with light
winds and pleasant weather
In Company with the J. Thomas
This 24 hours Ends with pleasant
weather Depth of water 50 fathoms
Lat 40..25

Sunday November 13
1817
This 24 hours Begins with light
winds and pleasant weather found
a dead whale with one iron
in her fluke of S. G. J.
We did not take her She had
been dead too long This 24 hours
Ends with pleasant
Depth of water 50 fathoms
Lat 41..7

Monday November 14
1817
This 24 hours Begins light
winds and thick weather See
two Right whales the middle
and last part fresh gales
and Cloudy weather Depth
of water 45 fathoms
Lat 41..48

Tuesday November 15
1817
This 24 hours Begins with fresh
gales and Cloudy weather See
Whales put off after them
The very Rugged we did not
stop the Depth of water 47
fathoms Lat 42..30
