See a plenty Black fish put off
and got two So ends this 24 hours
with pleasant weather all hands employed
in trying Depth of water 47 fathoms
Lat

Wednesday
Dec¹⁷
1817 This 24 hours Begins with fresh
gales and pleasant weather put 40 bbls
of oil down between decks this 24
hours ends with pleasant weather
all hands employed in stowing
down the oil Depth of water
45 fathoms

Thursday
Dec¹⁸
1817 This 24 hours Begins with
pleasant weather in Company
with 4 sail So ends this 24 hours
with pleasant weather
Depth of water 54 fathoms
Lat 44. 22.

Friday
Dec¹⁹
1817 This 24 hours Begins with
pleasant weather Spoke the
Ship Massachusetts of De Haven
D. Buxton Also the Ship
Ratcliff of London Kidd
Marten the Ship Nelson of
Do Buxton Depth of water
52 fathoms Lat 44. 22.

Saturday
Dec²⁰
1817 This 24 hours Begins with
light winds and pleasant weather
Spoke the Brig Ogenoy
of Fairhaven the last
part of this 24 hours fresh
gales Depth of water 55
fathoms Lat
