Friday May 8 th 1818	This 24 hours begins with light winds and pleasant weather the Middle and latter part of this 24 hours light winds and pleasant weather in company with the Ship South America George Clark Master Lat 24° 18' N Long 62° 37' W
Saturday May 9 th 1818	This 24 hours begins with light winds and pleasant weather the Middle and latter part the same see great quantities of Gullweed caught tow Ballin Lat 25° 04' N Long 63° 30' W
Sunday May 10 th 1818	This 24 hours begins with light wind and pleasant weather the Middle and latter part squally with rain Lat 25° 31' N Long 64° 10' W
Monday May 11 th 1818	This 24 hours begins with light winds and pleasant weather the Middle and latter part fresh gales and pleasant Lat 26° 07' N Long 65° 23' W
Tuesday May 12 th 1818	This 24 hours begins with light winds and pleasant weather the Middle and latter part light winds and pleasant Lat 26° 30' N Long 66° 29' W
Wednesday May 13 th 1818	This 24 hours begins with light winds and pleasant weather the Middle and latter part the same All hands Employed in Scraping and painting the Bends Lat 27° 20' N Long 66° 59' W
Thursday May 14 th 1818	This 24 hours begins with light winds and pleasant weather the Middle and latter part the same So Ends this 24 hours Lat 27° 43' N Long 67° 32' W
Friday May 15 th 1818	This 24 hours begins with light winds and pleasant weather the Middle and latter part of this 24 hours light winds Lat 28° 58' N Long 68° 19' W
Saturday May 16 th 1818	This 24 hours begins with light winds and pleasant weather at 2 M A see 3 Sail standing to the Eastward Landed the Starboard Down and tried the Current and found it set South East 1½ knots per hour Lat 29° 58' N Long 68° 29' W
Sunday May 17 th 1818	This 24 hours begins with light winds and pleasant weather the Middle and latter part fresh gales and thick weather Lat 31° 55' N Long 69° 51' W
