pleasant weather and set the top sail
And mended it and bent it again
The Middle and latter part light wind
Lat 33. 06 N Long 70. 05 W

Tuesday
May 19
1818
This 24 hours begins with light winds
And pleasant weather the Middle part
the same spoke the Brig Dawsey
Top from Baltimore Salem bound to old
Petersburg from Savannah 6 days
Lat 34. 11 N Long 71. 00 W

Wednesday
May 20
1818
This 24 hours begins with light winds
And pleasant weather the Middle and latter
part fresh gales and Squally weather
Lat 35. 22 N Long 70. 35 W

Thursday
May 21
1818
This 24 hours begins with fresh gales
And Cloudy weather the Middle part
the same See a School of Sperm
Whales but off struck one and the
line parted and they run to windward
And we could not strike again
So ends this with fresh gales and pleasant
Lat 36. 48 N Long 70. 45 W

Friday
May 22
1818
This 24 hours begins with fresh gales
And pleasant weather put off
Again after the same School but
could not strike spoke a
Brig 2 days from Baltimore Bound
To Leghorn did not see her name
The latter part of this 24 hours
light winds and pleasant weather
Lat 38. 2 N Long 71. 36 W

Saturday
May 23
1818
This 24 hours begins with light
Winds and pleasant spoke the Schooner
Brit Cap Talbot 44 hours from New
London bound to Bermuda
At 12 o'clock Sounded and found 110 fathoms
Close Reefed the top sails
At 8 AM have the top Cambric over
board the Wind to the Northward and
Eastward and Cloud weather the latter
part of this 24 hours fresh gales
Lat 38. 34 N Long 72. 22 W

Sunday
May 24
1818
This 24 hours begins with light fresh
Gales and Cloudy weather the
Winds at the N. E. at 6 PM
Sounded and found 40 fathoms of
Water at 10 Tacked Ship and Steered
To the Eastward with the wind N E
Spoke the Ship South America of
Sancti Spirit George Clark Bound
from this 24 hours & ends with light
Winds and pleasant weather
Lat 39. 18 N Long 72. 11 W

Monday
May 25
1818
This 24 hours begins with light winds
And pleasant weather the winds at
N W and a Small breeze
Sent the Cable all hands employ
In talking about the girls and one one
In hopes of being in company with
them soon at 10 PM spoke the
Lord bearing N W it proved to be
the East End of Long Island
