Monday Sept 6
Pleasant weather at 4 AM called all hands
and commenced cutting the other two
whales finished at twelve and commenced
hailing at the water at 4 o'clock landed
Lat N 37, 52 Long W 4, 30

Tuesday Sept 7th
Commenced with fine weather kind West Steady
E by South employed hailing sunds
Lat N 38, 08 Long W 41 00

Wednesday Sept 8th
Began with fine weather and ended the same
employed hailing kind West Steady E by S
the first part latter part South East Sounded
Lat N 38, 02 Long W 39, 17 W

Thursday Sept 9th
Commenced with fine pleasant weather from
the Westward Steady E by S middle part some what S by W
y spoke the Louisiana's back out with 100 Speer in fine
hailing at twelve turned up 11 barrels latter part fine
Steady E by S.
Lat N 37, 57 Long W 38, 14

Friday Sept 10th
Fine pleasant weather and moderate breeze
from the Westward Steady E latter part the
same saw two sails. Lat N Long W

Saturday Sept 11th
Began and ends with strong breeze and
suddenly first part Steady E latter part E by S
sounded three sails in sight employed coopers oil.
Lat N 38, 33 Long W 32, 48

Bound to the Western Islands

Sunday Sept 12th
Began and ends with a gale of wind Ship under
double reefed topsails encased at 1 A M bore some
heading to the NW under close reefed topsails at three
round and made double reef topsails again made Flores
ahead Steady E S E 16 miles as had to suggest to land here
to the Westward under short sail Sounded Lat N 39, 28 Long W 31, 28

Monday Sept 13th
Still blowing Ship here to an either track employed
littering about the fore and main rigging and sending
down royal yards at 3 PM more of Shore for the night
Still blowing from the SE.
Lat N 39, 18 Long W 31, 24

Tuesday Sept 14th
A gale of wind from the SE Ship here too on the
Starboard tack under close reefed main topsail and
the Sea close of the fore topsail heading West N West
at 6 AM more to the Eastward Still blowing with
occasional squalls Shore in sight Sounded
Lat N 39, 17 Long W 32, 18

Wednesday Sept 15th
Still blowing Ship here too on Starboard tack. Middle part
more moderate made close reefed topsails and fore sail
Steady E S E latter part fine and a strong breeze under double reefed
topsails & sails in sight. Lat N 38, 48 Long W

Thursday Sept 16th
Fine pleasant weather at 5 AM made the Island
of Guadal at 2 PM the Capt went on shore
returned at 7 PM Shorter sail and hoisted the ship
to make the land employed coopers oil
all sounds.

Friday Sept 17th
Fine weather and calm Capt went on shore sent off a
lighter with the series of 4 for the oil discharged 6 barrels &
17 gallons received 6000 onions. at 8 PM made sail for
Shore in company with the barque Address moderate
weather in end
