Commences with a moderate breeze with frequent rain squalls from the Eastward steering NW middle part moderate and calm wind hauled to the Southward ship by the wind heading from WSW to SW. latter part a strong breeze from NE ship by the wind backboard tack heading NW several sails in sight steering various courses. water employed in ship's duty sound.

Saturday Oct 23^d

Commences finely with SE Trades steering SE winds the same water varied by emptying.

Remarks Sunday Oct 24th

Commences with fine Trades from SE heading SW by S with a moderate breeze several sails in sight by night with a Spanish Barge steering WSW saw several shoals of black fish did not lower. several

Remarks Monday Oct 25th

Commences with fine pleasant weather from SE & ship by the wind heading SW Capt went on board the Swedish brig Thray of Westmick Bound to Rio at 1/2 past 2 returned latter part wind hauled to the Southward heading from West to W and moderate winds.

Long 25.53

Remarks Tuesday Oct 26th

Commences with moderate weather wind gradually hauling to the South West at 1/2 past 11 M heading West by N tack ship to the Eastward heading SE. at 9 AM tacked to the Westward wind moderate latter part a strong breeze South Eastward heading SW by S. water variously employed. saw a shoal of Black Fish did not lower sound.

Long by Chronometer 26.12 W

Remarks Wednesday Oct 27th

Fine pleasant weather and strong Trades from SE ship by W employed painting the Boats and various other jobs about the ship. one sail in sight sound these Twenty four Hours.
