Monday June 3^d

Came with strong breeze from the Westward
Ship by the wind on either tack under double
reef top sails and courses at 11 AM raised
the whale boat 3 boats but did not strike
Latter part more moderate 7 ships in sight &
plenty of whales spoke the California speaking
the bell on board

Lat 47, 23 S
Long 70, 16 E

1859

Tuesday June 4th

Strong breeze and overcast weather wind to the North
Ship on either tack at 4 AM lowered 3 boats for whales
struck one and laid a line to the waist 150 at plenty of
whales in sight. Latter part foggy down as spoke the bay
John Stewart of Manilla came on ship in sight

N. by Lat about 47, 54 S
Long 70 23 E

Wednesday June 5th

Commences with a gale from N N W and a thick fog
Ship on either tack under short sail. Middle part still
blowing plenty of whales in sight and one ship later
part of the foggy weather and a light breeze saw whales
lowered several times without success saw several ships
in sight

Lat. 47, 40 S
Long 70, 20 E

Thursday June 6th

Commences with a strong breeze from the N N E whales
in sight lowered 3 boats several times but without
success. Middle part blowing strong and thick
Latter part strong breeze but fine weather saw nothing
from ships to wind.

Lat. 47, 46 S
Long 70, 23 E
