employed in passing ship. Sailed

Ship Almirante Bound for New Holland

Remarks Friday March 4th

Commenced with fine pleasant weather wind N.W. Steering
S.E. in company with the Richard Mitchell. Middle part
the same. Latter part thick with rain at 5 1/2 A.M. wind
suddenly to the Westward in a gale ship under whole
main top sail double reefed fore & fore sail, employed
in various jobs about the ship down

Long by Chronometer 92,52 E

Saturday March 5th

Commenced with a strong breeze from the N.W. Steering
S.W. & S.E. under short sail in company
with the Richard Mitchell.
Middle part moderate at 4 A.M. wind hauled
suddenly to the Southward. Stowed on the deck
tack & then were ship heading E Starboard
tack on board. Latter part wind gradually
increasing and frequent rain so called ship under double
reefed top sail & fore sail winds broke out water

Long by Chronometer 95,15 E

Sunday March 6th

Commenced with a strong Breeze & heavy
squally rain from the South steering E by S
under short sail in company with the Richard
Mitchell. Middle part the same
but was being heading from E by S at 9 1/2 M
carried away the jib down by parting the lock ropes so
in the wind & weather the same
