The wind on the back and sail in
light winds.
Lat 27 12 S
Long 107 01 E

Wednesday March 14
Begins with fine weather from the
all sail set ship and gammed with the Eagle
of New Bedford also gammed with the Draco of New Bedford
Middle part wind & weather much the same
Latter part a fresh breeze from South ship by the wind
on different tacks looking for whales, four sails in
sight so ends this day
Lat 27 04 S
Long 107 01 E

Thursday March 15th
Begins with a brisk breeze from South ship heading
to the eastward two sails in sight
Middle part a fresh breeze from the same
Latter part a strong breeze from S. E. ship under
double reef heading S. E. weather overcast with appearance
of rain so ends the day
Lat 27 12 South
Long 107 54 East

Friday March 16
Begins with a strong breeze from S E
ship and enters back by the wind under double
reef fore and main top sail. Middle part -
the same Latter part the same weather with
chist reef fore and main top sails seen old.
Lat by Meridian Altitude 27 54
Long by Chronometer 107 14 E

Saturday March 17
Begins with a moderate gale from S E ship
by the wind on the tacks under double reef
main top sail and chist reef fore and spencers
masting in sight. Middle part the same Latter
part a strong breeze S E ship under chist reef
fore and main top sails seen old.
Lat by Meridian Altitude 27 38 S
Long by Chronometer 108 57 E

Sunday March 18
Begins with a moderate gale from S E
ship under chist reef fore and main top sails
steering S E by the wind on the tacks heading S E
one sail steering fore. Middle and Latter parts
ship by the wind on the tacks under chist reef
seen old

Lat by Meridian Altitude 27 00 S
Long by Chronometer 107 20 E
