variously employed.

Begins and ends with fine weather from
the SE steering N by S variously employed
nothing in sight Sails set day.

Sunday April 8

Begins with fine pleasant weather from
Eastward steering N by S and sail
in sight spoke the British Dunbar
Middle part by the wind heading S
Latter part steering N. N. W. all sail set
sails.

Long by Chronometer 107.25E

Monday April 9

Begins with fine weather from Eastward steering
N. N. W. all sail set at 5 wind hauled to the Southward
Ship by the wind at 6 hauled ship to the Eastward hauling
at 11 the sails in sight one the British Dunbar the other
an English merchant man steering about N. W. Middle
part weather the same under short sail. Ship on starters act
Latter part fine with a fresh breeze from the same
in sight. Sails set variously employed sails.

Tuesday April 10

Begins with fine weather from SE ship by the wind
under short sails with fresh breeze. with under Main
and fore top sails. watch variously employed
nothing in sight. Middle part fresh breeze from
SE. Ship on starters act hauling. Ship under
double reefed fore of Main top sails latter
part fine with strong breeze under double
reef & covered sails.

Wednesday April 11

Begins with a strong breeze from SE ship
under double reef & covered steering S. N. W. with
fine weather. Middle part by the wind hauling
S. S. W. Latter part weather the same steering
N. N. W. under double reefed sails.
