Came with light breeze from N.E. ship heading E.S.E. employed in mending Boats and ships duty the Bark Permilia in sight Boiling Middle part light breeze from East by ship by the wind on either tack. Latter part a good hole sail breeze from the N.E. ship heading on either tack employed in ships duty with one sail in sight. At ends this days work.

Monday December 3^d 1860

Came with a good hole sail breeze from the N.E. ship E by N employed in ships duty one sail in sight Middle part light breeze from the N.E. ship heading E.S.E. by the wind with the fore yard abaft. Latter part a good hole sail breeze from the N.E. ship steering W. at eleven spoke the Bark Permilia at twelve luffed to by the wind on the Starboard tack heading N.W. by N so ends.

Tuesday December 4th 1860

Came with light breeze from N.E. ship heading N.W. employed in mending Boats and ships duty the Bark Permilia in sight at half past six tack ship at sun set shortened sail ship heading E by N. Latter part light breeze from East by ship by the wind heading E by N Middle part wind from the N.E. ship steering W. employed in mending Boats and ships duty one sail in sight the Permilia so ends.

No Observation

Wednesday December 5th 1860

Came with light squalls and came the wind from all parts of the Compass at employed in mending Boats and ships duty got through mending the Boats at four o'clock at five o'clock spoke the Bark Permilia and gaped with her at half past six shortened sail ship heading E by N wind from the South Middle part breeze from the S by W. ship heading S.E. by E. With squalls of rain Latter part spoke Cam and rancy employed in repairing the Readhead so ends.

No Observation

Thursday December 6th 1860

Came with a sick balm employed in ship duty one sail in sight the Bark Permilia at four o'clock it sprung up a light breeze from S.E. ship heading N.E. by N. at half past five wore ship heading to the N.W. at sun set took in sail Middle and Latter part light breeze from S.E. at seven o'clock kept the ship W. by N. employed in ships duty the Bark Permilia in sight so ends.

Lat 23:1 S
Long 51:45 E

Friday December 7th 1860

Came with light breeze from S.E. ship steering W. by N. employed in ships duty the Bark Permilia in sight at sunset shortened sail and luffed by the wind with the fore yard abaft heading S.W. by W. Middle and Latter part light breeze from S.E. at six o'clock kept the ship off W. by N. employed in painting the Starboard Boat and ships duty the Bark Permilia in sight so ends.
