Came with light breeze and a calm with squalls of rain wind from S.E. at three A.M. Sprung up a fresh breeze from E.S.E. ship steering W. by N. employed in various jobs late fore. No luff set by the wind and jammed with the Dark Permian ship, hiding S.W. Middle part the same. Latter part strong breeze from S.E. with squalls of rain. Under Dolly reef topward and fore sail at half past nine O'clock P.M. both fore and Mizzen topsails wind still a breeze with one sail in sight 20 Ends

Thursday. December. 21st 1860

Came with Moderate Gail from S.E. and a heavy squall from the same ship. behind S.W. under Close reef. Main topsail and fore sails employed in ship duty and anything in sight but a cloud of fog. Middle part rather more moderate wind from the same place under the same sail. Latter part strong breeze from S.E. by E. ship steering S.W. by S. under Dolly reef. Sails double fore sail employed in ripping up the old Main sail and other jobs not anything in sight 20 ends.

Friday. December. 22nd 1860

Came with strong Breeze from S.E. by E. ship steering S.W. by W. employed in ship duty and bending a new Main sail. Middle part wind the same. Latter part strong breeze from S.E. ship steering W. employed in ship duty and a whale. Dolphin Bottom in sight 20 ends This Twenty four hours

Saturday. December. 23rd 1860

Came with a strong Breeze from E. with all sail set ship steering W. by N. employed in bending a new Main topsail and various other jobs. Middle part wind the same with squalls of rain ship steering the same latter part strong breeze from E.S.E. ship steering W. with all sail out employed in working ship a whale called a Pinball 20 ends This Twenty four hours

Sunday. December 24th 1860

Came with strong Breeze from E.S.E. with all sail out ship steering W. by N. employed in ship duty with one Dolphin Bottom in sight. Middle part wind and a lighter breeze ship steering W. by N. Latter part the same with heavy squalls from S.E. employed in bending the Old Main topsail. A school of Porpoises 20 ends This Twenty four hours

Monday. December 25th 1860

Came with strong Breeze from E. ship steering W. by N. employed in mending and sent down the Old fore topsail and bent the Old main topsail. A school of Porpoises. Middle part Moderate Breeze from N.E. rather lowery weather steering W. by N. Latter part strong Breeze from the same at half past eleven wind hauled out. W. with heavy squalls of rain so that we laid it up in the bay. Scupperd at Twelve O'clock P.M. wind hauled out to the N.W. and stopped raining steering W. employed in Ripping topsails 20 ends This Twenty four hours
