January Tuesday 15th 1861

Came with fresh breeze from W. ship heading N.W. W. with all sail out. Weather rather cloudy with squalls of rain employed in various jobs at sunset took in sail ship heading by the wind on the Starboard Tack at nine o'clock. Middle part wind came out to the S. about a moderate gail ship under double reef main top sail and spencers ship heading W.S. W. on the same tack. Middle part wind hauled to the S.W. E. ship heading S.W. under double reef main top sail and fore sail and spencers employed in sundry jobs as ends this twenty four hours &

Set fore and main top sail but main sail and spencer employed in various jobs as ends this twenty four hours &

January Thursday 17th 1861

Came with strong breeze from S.E. with squalls of wind and rain ship heading N.E. by E. under double reef top sail and courses gail and spencers employed in sundry jobs about the ship at one o'clock P.M. had a squall from the same at two quite fresh with rain took in main sail and set at three o'clock. At six quite moderate set the gail again at seven o'clock. Were ship heading S.W. by the wind. Middle part wind and whether the same. Latter part light breeze from the same at day light. Made all sail employed in Blacksmithing and other small jobs about the ship. As ends this twenty four hours.
