Ship two & blowing a Gale of wind from the West at 7 P.M.

February the 12 Day these 24 hours Commenced With ...

and Mizen topsail at 10 P.M. Set the Jib & mizen at
11 P.M. Set the mainsail & Main topgalant sail
& Reels out & 6 A.M. light winds & at 7 the watch ...
& plenty of bait & the watch employed in Ships Duty & C.
at 10 A.M. light winds & on haul the fore topsail & retained
& Sounded these 24 hours & in Lat by Chk 40. 55
South & Long in 52. 30. West & C.

February the 13 Day these 24 hours Commenced with
light winds & the watch employed in repairing the fore
sail & light winds from the South & pleasant
at 7 P.M. bent the fore topsail and middle
light winds & cloudy hazy weather. & C. and at
10 P.M. Calms & latter part of these 24 hours Eads in
fog & fowling & Calms in lat by Chk 40. 48
South & in Long 53. 10. West & C.

February the 14 Day these 24 hours Commenced
with light breeze & the watch employed in Ships
Duty & C. at 4 P.M. Saw blackies & towed a way &
got 4 of them a long Side & hove them in & a Strong
breeze of wind from S. W. & middle part a Strong
breeze & at 8 P.M. Commenced boiling blackfish blubber
& 9 P.M. more mowed & pleasant and Sounded these 24
in boiling blackfish blubber & in lat 39. 33 South
& Long in 54. 03. West & C.

February the 15 Day these 24 hours Commenced With
light winds & the watch employed in Ships Duty at Calms
at 5 P.M. tried to Git. Soundings but did not get it
& 6 P.M. got a large Surfish & Calms at 10 P.M. a light
breeze of wind & middle part a Good breeze from the S. W.
& pleasant weather at 7 P.M. pleasant & all hands attending
the Sd Sabbath. at 10 P.M. Good breeze & pleasant weather
& Sounded these 24 hours in Lat by Chk 39. 55. South
& Long in 55. 12. West as the gauge

February the 16 Day these 24 hours Commenced with pleasant
weather & a Good breeze from the S. W. & C. at 4 P.M. Strong
breeze at 5 P.M. took in the main topgalant sail & C. at
10 P.M. a Strong breeze & Closed reef the mizen topsail at 1 P.M.
Double reef topsails a Strong breeze from W. W. W. at 4 P.M.
mizen wore ship at 5 P.M. winds light from the West
at 7 Calms at 8 P.M. the watch employed in making pad
for the boats & Sounded but no bottom Green water and
heavy mizen on the water 10 P.M. Sent down the main topgalant
sail & Sounded these 24 hours with Calms & in lat by
Chk 40. 06. South & Long in 57. 12 West

February the 17 Day these 24 hours Commenced with
the watch employed in Ships Duty bent another topsail
sail & at 3 P.M. Sent the yards up & light breeze
from the N. W. W. at 5 P.M. Saw the Spout
a fin back whale at 7 Sounded but no bottom at 11 P.M.
a Strong breeze north & thick fog at 4 A.M. broke away
& C. at 2. a. Strong breeze & Double reefed topsails & thunder
and lightning & Sun rain at 3 P.M. a severe Squall
& Shot our four oars to pieces at Day light on bent it
and bent another one & Sounded & found bottom 65 fathoms
Reeled out at 10 P.M. Strong breeze from the S. W. W. and
Sounded these 24 hours & in Lat by Chk 40. 07 South
and in Long 59. 45 West
