Sunday Nov 14

First part of these 24 hours a strong breeze from N.W. with thick rainy weather steered E.S.E. at 6 P.M. hauled the topgallant sails and double reefed the main top sail middle part more moderate set the topgallant sails latter part a strong breeze from N.W. hauled the topgallant sails and backed ship and headed E.N.E.

Monday Nov 15

First part of this day a strong gale from N.W. with thick rainy weather hauled all sail except a fore reefed main top sail and fore sail at 7 P.M. hauled the fore sail and took in the waist boat and turned up the larboard boat had a heavy gale through the night with thunder lightning and rain split the fore topmast stay sail latter part more moderate with the wind from the westward made some sail.

Tuesday Nov 16

Commenced with a strong breeze from N.W. with squally weather steered E.S.E. at 6 P.M. hauled the fore and main top sail and fore sail latter part more moderate turned the reef out of the main top sail the watch employed in fitting the boats so Ends

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Wednesday Nov 17

First part of these 24 hours a strong gale from N.W. with squally weather steered E.S.E. middle part heavy squalls of rain latter part clear weather saw a brig steering to the Eastward the watch employed in ships duty so Ends

Thursday Nov 18

Begins with a strong breeze from N.W. steered E.S.E. turned one reef out of the main top sail and set the main topgallant sail latter part fine pleasant weather made all sail all hands employed in breaking out and stowing away the rigging so Ends this day

Friday Nov 19

First part of these 24 hours a light breeze from the westward steered E.S.E. with all sail set latter part all hands employed in setting up the main rigging and topmast back stays and rigging so Ends with fine weather

Saturday Nov 20

First part of these 24 hours a light breeze from N.W. steered E.S.E. with all sail set middle part latter parts continues much the same the watch employed variously so Ends

Sunday Nov 21st

First part of these 24 hours a fresh breeze from the southward with squally weather steered by the wind heading E.S.E. at 3 P.M. saw part of a barques mainmast with the crockets on at 6 h. hauled the topgallant sails and reefed the main top sail at 7 double reefed the fore and main top sails latter part turned the reef out and steered S.E. by E. so Ends
