

Remarks on Board of Ship Herald

Monday Nov. 22.

Lat 36°15' Long 43°05' Begins with a strong breeze from the westward with clear weather steered S.E. by E. middle part heavy squalls of rain double reefed the topsails hauled up the mainsail hauled the gaff latter part turned one reef out of the topsails and set the fore and main top gallant sails and gaff. so ends

Tuesday Nov. 23.

Lat 35°15' Long 43°32' Commences with a strong breeze from N.E. steered N.E. by E. all hands employed in breaking out the fore hatchway for water latter part squally with turned the reefs out of the topsails. so ends

Wednesday Nov. 24.

Lat 34°38' Long 41°02' Begins with a fresh breeze from E.S.E. steered by the wind heading S.E. minute and latter part a fresh gale from N.E. steered E.S.E. double reefed the topsails hauled gaff and spunkies saw a whaling bark heading to the S.E. so ends

Thursday Nov. 25.

Lat 33°28' Long 39°00' Commences with a strong gale from N.W. with squally weather steered S.E. by E. at 6 P.M. hauled the mainsail and closed reefed the fore top sail at 8 hauled the fore top sail latter part the fore top sail gaff and mainsail. so ends

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Friday Nov. 26.

Lat 32°35' Long 38°41' Commences with a strong breeze from N.E. with squally weather steered S.E. at 4 P.M. hauled the mainsail at 6 hauled the fore top sail and close reefed the main at 7 P.M. set the fore sail saw a merchant bark to the leeward. so ends

Saturday Nov. 27. Begins with a strong breeze from E.S.E. steered by the wind heading S.E. at 8 P.M. hauled the fore sail middle and latter part heavy squalls of rain took in the waist boat and turned up the larboard boat at noon wore ship heading E.S.E. so ends

Sunday Nov. 28th.

Lat 31°02' Long 37°00' Begins with a strong gale from N.E. at 1 P.M. set the fore sail latter part the fore top sail No observations turned one reef out of the main at 6 P.M. close reefed the main top sail middle part much thinner lightening and rain latter part more moderate set the fore top sail and mainsail and turned one reef out of the main top sail. saw a bark heading East. so ends

Monday Nov. 29.

Commences with a strong breeze from the south steered by the wind heading S.E. latter part more moderate turned the reefs out of the topsails and set the gaff. the weather cloudy and squally. so ends no observations

Tuesday Nov. 30.

Lat 32°59' Long 34°18' Begins with a strong breeze from N.E. to S.W. with squally weather steered by the wind to the S.E. at 6 P.M. set the main top gallant sail latter part calm the watch employed in setting up the head stay. so ends
