

Remarks on Board Ship Herald of F. H.

Saturday Jan. 29.

Lat 31-52
Long 46-41

First part of this day a light breeze from the northward steered by the wind to the eastward at daylight made all sail saw 2 sails latter part continues the same fitted the cutting block, stocks and rigged up the old Union topsail

Sunday Jan 30th

Lat 31-56
Long 45-31

Begins with a light breeze from the northward steered to the eastward at sunset shortened sail at daylight made all sail saw 2 sails saw breeches and run for them but saw nothing more of them so ends

Monday Jan 31st

Lat 31-12

First part of these 24 hours a light wind from the northward steered W by S at sunset shortened sail and wore ship at daylight made sail and bent the main topsail to repair

Tuesday February 1st 1848

Begins with a fresh breeze from S.W. with thick rainy weather at 5 P.M. shortened sail and headed S.W. latter part the wind from east made sail and steered west the watch employed in repairing the main topsail so ends

Wednesday Feb. 2nd

Lat 30-39
Long 47-47

Begins with a light breeze from the eastward steered west bent the main topsail at sunset shortened sail and luffed to the wind heading N.W. at daylight made sail and steered west saw one sail

Remarks on Board Ship Herald

Thursday Feb. 3rd

First part of this day a fresh breeze from E.S.E. steered to the westward at 4 P.M. luffed ship saw five sail at sunset shortened sail at daylight made sail steered S.W. saw 2 sails and when grasped the weather squally and rainy

Friday Feb. 4th

Begins with a strong breeze from E.S.E. steered south at 4 P.M. shortened sail and thick rainy weather at daylight made sail and steered by the wind to the S.W. latter part fine weather so ends

Saturday Feb. 5th

Lat 33-15

First part of this day a fresh breeze from S.W. at sunset shortened sail and by the main topsail aback heading to the E.S.E. at daylight made sail and steered to the wind to the westward saw grasped the watch employed in making repairs so ends

Sunday February 6th

Lat 34-49

Long 48-51

Begins with a strong breeze from the east steered by the wind to the northward at sunset double reefed the topsails latter part a strong gale at 9 A.M. hauled the fore and main topsails fore sail and fore reefed the main topsail luffed up the starboard boat so ends

Monday Feb. 7th

Lat 35-34

Long 48-01

Begins with a strong gale from S.W. with clear weather steered S.E. by E. at sunset hauled the fore topsail at daylight set the fore and main topsails at 7 P.M. the wind shifted to the northward and blew a gale hauled the fore and main topsails fore sail and fore reefed the main topsail luffed up the starboard boat so ends
