First part of this day a fresh breeze from S.E.
 Lat 36-25 set the fore sail fore and main topsails and
 Long 48-18 steered by the wind to the S.W. at daylight
 made sail and steered S.E. the wind from
 S.E. and moderate so Ends

Wednesday Feb. 9

Commenced with a fresh breeze
 from the northward steered S.E. with top gallant
 Lat 37-12 sails set at sunset shortened sail and before
 Long 48-27 the wind heading E.S.E. middle part rainey
 latter part clear weather made all sail and
 steered S.E. so Ends

Thursday Feb. 10

First part of this day a fresh breeze from
 Lat 38-12 S.W. at 10 P.M. spoke a
 Dutch ship, Chapmanus, at sunset shortened
 sail and headed to the westward latter
 part a thick fog steered off S.W.

Friday Feb. 11. Begins with squally rainey weather
 with a baffling wind at 10 P.M. spoke Bark
 Canett at first part latter part clear

Lat 37-46 weather with the wind from the southward
 Long steered W. S.W. with all sail set. the watch
 employed in making spungarn. so Ends

Saturday Feb. 12.

First part of these 24. hours a light
 Lat 36-47 breeze from S.E. steered S.E. at sunset
 Long 50-36 shortened sail at daylight made sail
 latter part a strong breeze from the
 northward the watch employed in
 making spungarn. so Ends

Sunday Feb. 13.

Begins with a strong breeze from the northward
 Lat 36-43 at 14 P.M. took a ship and steered to the
 Long 48-36 Eastward latter part a fresh gale at 8 P.M.
 close reefed the fore and main topsails. so Ends

Monday Feb. 14. Commenced with a strong gale from the
 northward steered by the wind to the Eastward

at sunset hoisted the fore and main topsails
 latter part more moderate with the wind from
 S.E. and rainey set the topsails and turned
 the reefs out and set main top gallant sail
 steered S.E. so Ends

Tuesday Feb. 15. th

First part of this day a fresh breeze from S.E.
 Lat 35-29 steered S.E. at sunset hoisted the main
 Long 45-33 top gallant sail and mainsail at daylight
 double reefed the topsails and got the main
 sail the wind from the northward steered
 by the wind to the Eastward so Ends

Wednesday Feb. 16.

Begins with a strong breeze from the northward
 no observation steered by the wind to the S.E. latter part
 more moderate made sail at 1 P.M. took a
 to the westward saw a Bark to the windward
 weather thick and rainey. so Ends

Thursday Feb. 17

First part of this day a strong breeze from
 the northward with thick weather at sunset
 shortened sail at daylight saw 2 ships to the
 westward at 9 P.M. spoke ship, Benjamin of
 Ohio Redford turned the reefs out of the topsails.
 so Ends no observation

Friday Feb. 18. Begins with a light breeze from S.W.

Lat 34-35 steered S.W. at daylight set all sail
 Long 48-31 latter part pleasant weather went
 the main topsail to repair one sail
 in sight so Ends
