

Remarks on Board Ship Herald

Wednesday March 22

Lat = 44-11
Long 44-39
First part of these 24 hours a fresh breeze from N.W. steered E.S.E. by E. sent up the main topgallant yard. latter part continues the same steered E.S.E. so ends

Thursday March 23. Begins with a fresh breeze from N.W. steered E.S.E. with all sail set middle part the wind shifted round to south hauled the topgallant sails and mainsail and mizen top sail latter part made all sail so ends

Friday March 24

Lat 44-11
First part of this day a fresh breeze from the northward with thick weather steered E.S.E. with all sail set middle part shortened sail and lay a back at daylight made all sail latter part calm set up the main topmast stay so ends

Saturday March 25
no observation
First part of this day a light breeze from N.W. latter part a strong breeze from the westward steered East at 10 A.M. hauled the topgallant sails and mizen top sail and mainsail so ends with rainy weather

Sunday March 26

Lat 44-42
Long 34-52
Commences with thick rainy weather with the wind from the westward at 4 P.M. the wind hauled to N.W. and cleared off. set for main topgallant sail middle part a strong breeze from N.W. latter part more moderate made all sail steered E.S.E. so ends

Remarks on Board Ship Herald 1848

Monday March 27

Lat 41-11
First part of this day a light breeze from the westward steered East with all sail set middle and latter parts a light breeze from the northward bent the lower and topmast sliding sails and set them so ends

Tuesday March 28. Begins with a fresh breeze from N.W. steered East middle part steered E.S.E. latter part a light breeze and baffling set up the main and mizen topmast back stays so ends

Wednesday March 29

Lat 39-35
Commences with light air and calms at 6 P.M. took a drake from S.E. steered E.S.E. saw finbacks and blackfish latter part had the wind from E.S.E. with thick weather so ends

Thursday March 30. Begins with a fresh breeze from E.S.E. with thick weather steered by the wind to the northward at 3 P.M. hauled the topgallant sails at 4 P.M. double reefed latter part a strong gale from the northward lay to under a close reefed main top sail heaving to the eastward so ends

Friday March 31. st

Lat 39-07
Long 23-11
Commences with a strong gale from N.W. at 4 P.M. set the fore sail and fore top sail and steered N.E. by E. latter part a little more moderate made some sail so ends
