

Remarks on Board Ship Herald

Saturday April 1st 1848

Begins with a fresh breeze from N.W. sets all sail and steers E. by N. at 6 P.M. hauled the topgallant sails & middle part the wind from the westward set the topgallant sails and studding sails latter part the wind hauled to S.E. & so ends

Sunday April 2. Begins with a strong breeze from S.W. with squally weather steered by the wind to the eastward latter part the wind from S.E. with a strong breeze and cloudy weather. caught a porpoise. so ends

Monday April 3.

First part of this day a strong breeze from E. steered by the wind to the S.E. at 4 P.M. hauled the fore and main topgallant sails latter part a strong gale with rainy weather, laying to heading to the Eastward. so ends

Tuesday April 4. First part of this day a strong gale from N.W. steered E. by N. latter part clear weather with a high sea so ends

Wednesday April 5.

Begins with a strong gale from N.W. steered E. by N. latter part moderate made all sail and steered East so ends

Thursday April 6. Commences with a fresh breeze from N.W. steered East with all sail set latter part a light breeze on bent the old main topsail and bent a new one so ends

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Friday April 7.

First part of this day a light breeze from N.W. on bent the mainsail to repair latter part continues the same repaired the mainsail and bent it so ends

Saturday April 8. Begins with a light breeze from N.W. steered S. by E. with all sail set hauled the fore and main topgallant sails latter part a strong breeze from West so ends

Sunday April 9.

First part of this day a strong breeze from the westward steered S. by E. at 5 P.M. hauled the fore and main topgallant sails and shifted the studding sails latter part the wind from the northward set the topgallant sails so ends

Monday April 10. Begins with a strong breeze from N.W. steered S. by E. at 2 P.M. hauled the topgallant sails middle part hauled the mainsail and main topsail had some thunder lightning and rain latter part made some sail so ends

Tuesday April 11

All three 24 hours a strong breeze from N.W. steered S. by E. with fore topmast studding sail set, on bent the main spencer and ripped it up. so ends

Wednesday April 12. First part of this day a fresh breeze from N.W. steered S. by E. middle

part the wind from N.E. with thunder lightning and rain hauled the topgallant sails latter part clear weather with the wind from N.W. made all sail so ends
