

Remarks on Board Ship *Herald* of Fairhaven
Thursday April - 13th 1848

Begins with a fresh breeze from N.W.
Lat 39=40 Steered S.E. with all sail set saw black
Long fish and porpoises, middle part a light
breeze from the south latter part a strong breeze
from the westward. so ends

Friday April 14 First part of this day a strong breeze
from west steered S.E. with all sail set
made and latter part squally weather
so ends
no observation

Saturday April 15

First part of this day a strong breeze
from the westward steered S.E. by E. with
all sail set latter part calm the watch
employed in repairing the old main
top sail. no observation

Sunday April 16

First part of this day calm and
cloudy took the iron hoops out of the fore
hold and put them in the after hold
Lat 39=58 middle part a strong breeze from N.W. with
Long 23=14 squally weather latter part clear weather with
the wind from N.W. steered S.E. by E.

Monday April 17

First part of this day a strong breeze
from N.W. steered S.E. by E. latter part
Lat 39=52 a light breeze from the westward saw
Long 26=26 a sail steading to the S.E. the watch
employed in repairing the main top sail.
so ends

Remarks on Board Ship *Herald* 1848
Tuesday April 18

Begins with a light gale from the westward
Lat 39=54 at 12 P.M. saw 2 little whales leaved 2 boats
Long 28=26 for them but could not get on to them at sunset
come on board and steered S.E. by E. latter part
continues much the same so ends

Wednesday April 19

Commences with light gale and
calms middle and latter part a light breeze
from N.W. steered S.E. with all sail set
Lat 40=17 the watch employed in repairing the main
Long 31=14 top sail. so ends

Thursday April 21

First part of this day a fresh breeze from
Lat 41=39 N.W. steered S.E. with all sail set at 6 P.M.
Long 34=28 hauled the fore and main top gallant sails
latter part continues the same.

Friday April 21

Begins with a strong breeze from
N.W. steered S.E. by E. with all sail set
at 6 P.M. the wind hauled to S.W.
Lat 41=11 latter part continues the same
Long 38=30 so ends

Saturday April 22

Commences with a fresh breeze from N.E.
steered S.E. by E. with all sail set latter
Lat 41=30 part a light breeze from the northward
Long 41=39 the watch employed in ship duty so ends

Sunday April 23

First part of this day a light
breeze from the northward steered S.E. by E.
latter part calm with a thick fog
no observation
