

Remarks on Board Ship Herald 1848

Sunday June 18.

Commences with a light breeze from S.E. steered W. by N. on bent the foresail and bent the old one latter part continues the same so ends

Monday

June 19 First part of this day a fresh breeze from S.E. steered by the wind to the S.E. at 6 A.M. saw three signs steered off to the northward at noon huddled up to the S.E. so ends with a strong breeze

Tuesday June 20.

First part of this day a strong breeze from the southward steered S.E. at 1 P.M. saw new Zealand middle part some light squalls of rain latter part the wind from the westward steered S.E. at 4 P.M. some meet from the fore peak to the after hold so ends

Wednesday

June 21 Commences with a light breeze from the westward steered S.E. on bent the mainsail to repair latter part had the water employed in repairing the main sail so ends

Thursday June 22

First part of these 24 hours a fresh breeze from S.E. with cloudy weather steered S.E. by E. latter part continues the same the watch employed in repairing the mainsail so ends

Friday

June 23 All this day a fresh breeze from S.E. to E. steered by the wind to the S.E. at 1 P.M. saw three signs steered off to the northward at noon huddled up to the S.E. so ends with a strong breeze

Saturday June 24.

Begins with a moderate breeze from S.E. steered ship and steered by the wind to the S.E. finished the main sail and bent it middle and latter parts a strong breeze with squalls of rain huddled the topgallant sails and double reefed the top sails no observation made all sail on bent the gill and bent a new one so ends

Sunday

June 25 All this day a strong breeze from S.E. steered by the wind to the S.E. saw one west 179° 07' fin back. so ends

Monday June 26.

Begins with a strong breeze from S.E. steered by the wind to the S.E. latter part continues the same on bent the main topsail to repair

Tuesday

June 27 Commences with a strong breeze from S.E. latter part continues the same steered by the wind to the S.E. at noon were ship the watch employed in repairing the main topsail so ends

Wednesday June 28

First part of this day with strong gale from S.E. steered to the S.E. by E. latter part squally and rainy huddled main sail and fore topsail so ends

Thursday

June 29 First part of this day a strong breeze and visible with squally weather middle and latter parts more moderate no observation made all sail on bent the gill and bent a new one so ends
