no observation Commences with squally weather at 1 P.M. hauls down the topgallant sails and double reefs the topsails at 3 turned the reef out and set the topgallant sails latter part continues much the same so ends

July 1st Begins with squalling wind from N.E. to S.E. with squally rainy weather middle and latter part the wind from S.E. to south by E. with all sail set see finbacks and blackfish so ends

Sunday July 2nd Commences with a fresh breeze from S.W. starboard N.E. with all sail set latter part continues the same caught one pupus so ends

July 3rd First part of this day a fresh breeze from S.W. starboard N.E. with all sail set latter part a light breeze at 10 P.M. spoke Banks made of skew - Chafers 23 meters out 170. square so ends

Tuesday July 4th

no observation Begins with light airs and calms latter part a fresh breeze from the eastward with cloudy weather starboard by the wind to the N.E. saw one finback

Wednesday

July 5th Commences with thick rainy weather with the wind from the eastward at 1 P.M. hauls down the topgallant sails at 3 double reefs the topsails at 4 hauls down the fore and main topsails at 5 hauls down the fore and main topsails at 7 with heavy squalls of rain so ends

Thursday July 6th

Begins with a strong gale from N.E. with squally weather at 2 P.M. set the fore topsail and main sail starboard by E. middle and latter part the wind from the southward with clear weather made all sail so ends

July 7th Commences with a strong breeze from S.W. starboard north repaired the fore topsail and bent it latter part more moderate set up the head stays. see some finbacks so ends

First part of this day a moderate breeze from S.W. starboard N.E. saw a sail to the N.E. of us repaired the fore topsail staysail and bent it latter part continues the same repaired the main topgallant sail

July 9th Commences with a moderate breeze from S.W. with cloudy weather starboard N.E. by E. the watch employed in repairing the main topsail latter part continues with fine weather saw a number of finbacks so ends

Monday July 10th

Begins with a light breeze from the eastward with fine weather starboard N.E. at 10 P.M. pass the long the island of Waipoo latter part bent the chains at 11 took a pilot and beat up for the anchorage at 3 P.M. let go the anchor in 30 fathoms of water and commenced coasting the ship's side stripping off the sheathing round the bows to find the leak
