at 6 A.M. calms. at 9 A.M. a light breeze from N.E. steered by the wind to the S.W. saw a ship to the leeward hauled the anchors and stowed away the chains

Thursday July 26.

Begins with a fresh breeze from N.E. at 6 P.M. steered ship to the S.E. saw a sail to the S.W. & later part continues with fine weather. saw 2 sails the land in sight. so ends

Friday July 28.

Begins with a light breeze from N.E. & steered by the wind to the S.E. on bent the main topsail and top gallant sail and bent others. later part continues the same. so ends

Saturday July 29

Lat 21-13

First part of this day a light breeze from the northward steered off by S.W. with all sail set. later part continues the same the watch employed variously. so ends

Sunday July 30.

Lat 20-24

31. First part of this day a light breeze from N.W. steered off by S.W. with all sail set. at 2 P.M. saw a sail to the S.W. later part light airs and calms saw one finback. so ends

Monday July 31st

Commences with light airs and calms steered S by S. at sunset shortened sail at daylight made sail at 8 A.M. double reefed the topsails at 9. hanged 3/4 main topsail and mainsail at 10. hauled the fore topsail and close reefed the main one. so ends with heavy squalls of rain no observation

Tuesday August 1st

Lat 21-50

Commences with a strong gale from N.W. with heavy squalls with rain. at daylight made all sail and steered by the wind to the S.W. with the wind from N.W. saw nothing. so ends

Wednesday August 2nd

Lat 21-58
Long 17

First part of this day a light breeze from N.W. steered by the wind to the westward at sunset shortened sail. later part a light breeze made all sail and steered by the wind to the S.E. saw some finbacks. put on new fore and main brace pennants. so ends
