

Sunday Sept 24.

Lat 31-25 First part of this day a light breeze from the westward steered by W. with all sail set at sunset hauled the topgallant sails at daylight set them again the wind from the northward so ends

Monday Sept 25. First part of this day a fresh breeze from the northward steered by W. latter part the wind from the southward steered by the wind to the westward so ends

Lat 32-56

Tuesday Sept 26.

Begins with a fresh breeze from W. by N. tack the ship and steered by the wind heading S by W. latter part a strong breeze from N. by E. at 6 P.M. double reefed the topsails and hauled the jib at noon ship to the N. by W. saw a sail to the windward so ends
Wednesday Sept 27. Begins with a light breeze from S. by W. steered by the wind to the eastward turned the reef out and set main topgallant sail. latter part a strong gale from S. by W. took in all sail hauled aloft reefed main topsail and lay by the wind heading to the southward

Thursday Sept 28.

All this day a strong gale from S. by W. to South latter part wore ship off. began to the westward set the fore topsail and hauled it again so ends
Lat 34-36 Long 157-28

Friday Sept 29. Commences with a strong gale from S. by E. middle part calm at daylight made sail and steered W. by N. with a light breeze from S. by E. the watch employed in repairing the main topsail
Lat 34-21

Saturday Sept 30.

Begins with a light breeze from the N. by W. steered by W. at 2 P.M. saw blackfish. hoared and got 2 of them latter part a strong gale hauled the fore and main topsails and double reefed the main so ends
Lat 35-55

Sunday Oct 1st All this day a strong gale from S. by W. at 6 P.M. wore ship and double reefed the eastward so ends
no observation

Monday Oct 2nd

First part of this day a strong gale from S. by W. latter part fine weather set the topsails and topgallant sails and steered W. by N. saw a number of finbacks. hauled out the blackfish blubber so ends
Lat 35-57 Long 158-45

Tuesday Oct 3. Begins with a light breeze from the eastward steered west middle part continues the same at daylight made sail at 7 A.M. the wind shifted to S. by E. and blew a gale shortened sail so ends
Lat 36-15

Wednesday Oct 4

All this day a strong breeze from S. by E. with changeable weather at 9 P.M. spoke ship Sally Anne of New Bedford 16 months out got saw a number of finbacks so ends
no observation

Thursday Oct 5. First part of this day a strong breeze from S. by E. steered west at sunset shortened sail at daylight set the fore topsail and steered S. by E. with thick weather saw the Sally Anne to the windward so ends
no observation
