Friday Nov. 24

At 7 A.M. cast off from the wharf the steamer took us in tow and carried us in to Sydney Cove where we dropped both anchors. set up the main and mizen top gallant masts and yards and bent the sails.

Saturday Nov. 25

All this day fine weather all hands to work on the rigging and scraping the ship in the fore took on board Solomon, Dickinson and Albert Dean that had before deserted.

Sunday Nov. 26

All this day fine pleasant weather.

Monday Nov. 27

All these 24 hours fine weather scraped the ship on the starboard side and painted it with red one side of the quarter deck.

Tuesday Nov. 28

All this day fine weather scraped the ship on the starboard side and painted it and finished calking the deck.

Wednesday Nov. 29

All this day a strong breeze with clear weather all hands employed in scraping and painting.

Thursday 30

All this day fine weather painted the ship round and coal tarred the bends.

Friday Dec. 1st 1848

All this day a strong breeze with clear weather all hands employed in setting up the rigging and rigging out the gibbets.

Saturday Dec. 2

At 9 A.M. got under way and went down the bay and let go the anchor and furled the sails the weather thick rainy weather.

Sunday Dec. 3rd

All this day thick rainy weather.

Monday Dec. 4

All this day fine pleasant weather all hands employed in setting up the rigging.

Tuesday Dec. 5

All this day fine weather rigged out the flying jibboom bent the shill and set up the rigging.
