

# Remarks on Board of the Ship Nevada

Tuesday March 6<sup>th</sup>

Begins with light breezes from the South heading ENE at 2 P.M. tacked ship and saw a fair Bark at 3 miles the Barque Belle 2 months out from Sydney 200 Bbls of sperm oil at 6 saw Black fish and hauled two Boats the mainst Boat struck and lost five men by the parting of his line and short wave at sun down shortened sail at Day Light made sail steaming by the wind to the NW at 4 A.M. run off to the ENE at 9 hauled by the wind to the southward latter part fresh breezes from the NW saw two sails and the land in sight the watch Employed on ships Duty Lat 34-48 so Ends

Wednesday March 7<sup>th</sup>

First part of this Day fresh breezes from the S.W. heading SSE at 1 P.M. hauled the fore topgallant sail at 3 tacked ship heading NW at sun down shortened sail at Day Light made sail steaming by the wind to the westward latter part light breezes from the S.W. at 10 A.M. spoke the Canton Packet of New Bedford 41 months out 2100 Bbls of sperm oil 4 sail in sight and the land in sight Lat 34-35 so Ends these 24 hours

Thursday March 8<sup>th</sup>

Begins with light winds from the S.W. steaming by the wind to the westward at 3 P.M. spoke the ship Albion of fair Haven 19 months out 380 Bbls of sperm oil and 270 of whale at 4 saw some fair Boats at sun down shortened sail at Day Light made sail steaming NW two sail in sight at 10 A.M. saw a Merchant Brig steaming to the Eastward latter part light winds from the S.W. with fine weather and the land in sight the watch Employed unbending and bending a new fore sail and Repairing the old one Lat 34-02 South so Ends these 24 hours

Friday March 9<sup>th</sup>

First part of this Day light winds from the Southward steaming NW at 3 P.M. saw a shoal of Black fish at sun down shortened sail and hauled by the wind to the westward at Day Light made sail steaming by the wind to the westward at 7 A.M. wore ship heading ENE latter part light winds from the SE with fine weather the land in sight at 10 saw Black fish and hauled three Boats But did not strike at 11 A.M. came on Board the watch Employed Repairing the fore sail Lat 33-28 Long 171-54 so Ends

# Remarks on Board of the Ship Nevada

Saturday March 10<sup>th</sup>

Begins with a calm at 5 P.M. light airs of wind from the SE heading NE by E at sun down shortened sail at Day Light made sail heading SSE the land in sight latter part light airs of wind from the Eastward with fine weather the watch Employed Repairing the fore sail Lat 33-44 South so Ends

Sunday March 11<sup>th</sup>

First part of the Day light winds from the Eastward heading SSE at 4 P.M. saw two sail at 5 saw Black fish hauled two Boats But did not strike at sun down shortened sail and wore ship heading NNE at Day Light made sail and tacked ship heading SSE at 10 A.M. saw two sail and saw fair Boats at 11 sent two Boats in fishing latter part light winds from the Eastward with fine weather Lat 34-08 South

Monday March 12<sup>th</sup>

Commences with light winds from the Eastward steaming by the wind to the NNE at 5 P.M. came on Board with some fish with the top of a Boat anchor and 9 fathoms of rope at sun set hauled the topgallant sails and flying jib at Day Light set the topgallant sails and flying jib heading NW at 8 A.M. saw a sail steaming to the Eastward at 9 hauled the topgallant sails and flying jib and tacked ship heading ENE the land in sight latter part fresh breezes from the Northward with varying weather no Observation so Ends these 24 hours

Tuesday March 13<sup>th</sup>

First part of this Day fresh breezes from the Northward heading ENE at 1 P.M. saw a sail at 2 wore ship heading NW set the main topgallant sail at sun set shortened sail at Day Light made some sail heading NW at 7 A.M. wore ship heading NE at 9 set the topgallant sails and flying jib and saw a sail steaming to the NE latter part light winds from the NW the watch Employed filling him main topsail Lats Lat 33-30 South so Ends these 24 hours

Wednesday March 14<sup>th</sup>

Begins with light winds from the NW to South steaming NW by NW at sun set shortened sail and wore ship heading E by N at Day Light made some sail heading NE one sail in sight at 8 A.M. wore ship heading South set the topgallant sails and flying jib latter part light winds from the Eastward the watch Employed filling him foot ropes for the fore topsail yard Lat 33-04 South
