

Remarks on Board of the Ship Herald

Sunday March 25th

Commences with fresh Breezes from the Westward at 1 P.M. hauled the main topgallant sail and steeved S.E. by S at 2. saw a shoal of porfish at 4 saw the land at 6 steamed E by S the land bearing from S.E. to S.W. Distance 25 miles at Day Light steaming East. Latter part light winds from the Westward steaming South with all sail set saw Grampus's Lat 36-41 South Long 176-43 East so Ends

Monday March 26th

Begins with fresh Breezes from the N.W. steaming South with all sail set at 2 P.M. saw the land at sun set shortened sail steaming E by N the land bearing South to W.W. Distance 30 miles at Day Light made all sail steaming by the wind to the N.E. at 8 A.M. steamed E by S saw two sail steaming S.E. the land in sight latter part fresh Breezes from the N.W. the watch Employed on ships duty Lat 37-24 Long 178-47

Tuesday March 27th

First part of this day strong Breezes from the N.W. steaming S.E. at 1 P.M. hauled the topgallant sails and flying jib at 2 double reefed the topsails and hauled up the spanker at sun set shortened sail and hauled to the wind heading N.E. by N at 7 A.M. steamed South at 10 turned the Reefs out of the topsails latter part light winds from the N.W. the watch Employed making Rattling stuff Lat 37-06 South Long 179-24 E so Ends

Wednesday March 28th

First part of this day light Breezes from the N.W. steaming S.E. at 1 P.M. set the main topgallant sail at 5 hauled to the wind heading N.E. by N at sun set shortened sail at 6 A.M. set the fore and main topsails double reefed steaming N by E at 9 hauled the main topsail latter part strong gales from the N.W. Lat 37-03 South Long 179-33 East so Ends

Thursday March 29th

Begins with strong gales from the N.W. steaming N by E at midnight weather more moderate made some sail latter part fresh Breezes from the N.W. the watch Employed making sinners Lat 34-32 South Long 178-58 West so Ends

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Friday March 30th

First part of this day strong Breezes from the N.W. steaming N by E at 2 P.M. steamed N.W. at 2 A.M. hauled the fore topgallant sail made and latter part fresh Breezes from the westward the watch Employed making spun yarn Lat 32-25 South Long 178-44

Saturday March 31th

Begins with fresh Breezes from the Westward steaming by the wind to the N by E at 2 P.M. spoke the Brig Genie of Sydney 5 weeks out 75 Bbls of sperm oil at 8 hauled the main topgallant sail and main sail at Day Light set the main sail steaming by the wind to the S.W. at 7 A.M. moved ship heading N by W at 9 turned the Reefs out of the fore and main topsails and set the main topgallant sail 4 sail in sight latter part fresh Breezes from the Westward the watch Employed on ships duty Lat 31-08 S Long 177-58

Sunday April 1st

First part of this day fresh Breezes from the Westward steaming by the wind to the S by W at 2 P.M. hauled the flying jib and main topgallant sail at 5 spoke the schooner Delina of New Bedford 3 months out from Sydney 40 Bbls of sperm oil at sun set shortened sail 4 sail in sight at Day Light made sail steaming by the wind to the Westward at 9 A.M. spoke the ship Starbuck of San Francisco 44 months out 1650 Bbls of sperm oil latter part fresh Breezes from the Southward 3 sail in sight so Ends

Monday April 2nd

Begins with light Breezes from the Southward steaming by the wind to the N.W. at 3 P.M. spoke the Barque Arabion of London 6 months from Sydney 300 Bbls of sperm oil at sun set shortened sail at Day Light made sail heading N.W. 2 sail in sight and the little Rocks in sight latter part light winds from the East the watch Employed on ships duty Lat 30-54 S so Ends

Tuesday April 3rd

Begins with light Breezes from the Eastward steaming N.W. at 5 P.M. hauled to the wind heading South at sun set shortened sail the little Rocks bearing E.N.E. Distance 18 miles at Day Light made sail steaming by the wind to the Northward the land in sight 4 sail in sight latter part fresh Breezes from the E.N.E. the watch Employed on ships duty no Obscure so Ends these 24 hours
