

Remarks on Board of the Ship Herald

Monday June 25th

Begins with fresh Breezes from the Eastward steering North Middle part continues the same at 8 A.M. set the fore topgallant sail steering N.W. with part light winds from the E.S.E. the watch Employed on ships duty Lat 01-24 South Long 172-58 W. 50 Ends

Tuesday June 26th

First part of this Day Light Breezes from the E.S.E. steering N.W. with all sail set Middle and Latter parts Light Breezes from the Eastward steering N.W. the watch Employed on ships duty Lat 00-24 South Long 174-28 West 50 Ends these 24 hours

Wednesday June 27th

Begins with light winds from the Eastward steering N.W. with all sail set Middle and Latter parts continues the same at 9 A.M. saw a large school of Black fish the watch Employed Bunting out the main Lat 00-28 North Long 175-24 West 50 Ends

Thursday June 28th

Commences with light air of wind from the E.S.E. steering N.W. at 5 P.M. steering N.W. S Middle part continues the same Latter part light winds from the Eastward steering West the watch Employed on ships duty Lat 00-31 North Long 176-33 W

Friday June 29th

First part of this Day Light Breezes from the E.S.E. steering by the wind heading S by W at 4 P.M. saw the island of New Pantuck at 6 sun set the island Bearing North distance 4 miles Middle part continues the same at 7 A.M. tacked ship heading N.W. Latter part light winds from the Eastward the watch Employed on ships duty Lat 00-14 South Long 176-40 West 50 Ends

Saturday June 30th

Begins with Light Breezes from the E.N.E. heading North the land in sight at sun set more ship heading S.E. the island Bearing E.N.E. distance 10 miles at 9 A.M. hoisted the fore topgallant sail Latter part fresh Breezes from the E.N.E. heading S.E. the watch Employed on ships duty Lat 01-08 South Long 176-07 West 50 Ends

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Sunday July 1st

First part of this Day fresh Breezes from the E.N.E. with squally weather heading S.E. at 1 P.M. hoisted the main and fore topgallant sails flying till and spanker and Double Reefed the fore and main topsails at sunset Double Reefed the main topsail at midnight more ship heading North Latter part weather more moderate turned the ship out of the topsails and set the main topgallant sail Lat 00-59 S Long 176-16 W

Monday July 2nd

Begins with fresh Breezes from the E.N.E. heading North at 3 P.M. hoisted the main topgallant sail at 5 saw Black fish at midnight more ship heading S.E. at 8 A.M. tacked ship heading N.W. and set the main topgallant sail at 10 saw a sperm Whale made all sail and worked to windward for them Latter part fresh Breezes from the N.E. Lat 00-02 South Long 176-10 West 50 Ends

Tuesday July 3rd

First part of this Day fresh Breezes from the Eastward heading S.E. at 2 P.M. lowered 4 Boats from the Whales the Landboard and Bow Boats struck and killed two at sun set got them to the ship cut out at 11 P.M. Latter part heading North at 3 A.M. saw the land more ship heading S by E at 9 commenced Boiling set the main topgallant sail and flying till Latter part weather the same at 11 more ship heading N.W. Lat 00-15 S Long 176-37 West 50 Ends these 24 hours

Wednesday July 4th

Begins with fresh Breezes from the Eastward heading N.W. at 3 P.M. saw the land at 6 more ship heading S by E the island Bearing N.W. distance 6 miles at midnight more ship heading N.W. at 9 A.M. the master went on shore at 11 P.M. came on Board with one cow fish Latter part continues the same Lat 00-14 S Long 176-44 West 50 Ends these 24 hours
