Remarks on board Ship Herald Wednesday 1st of October, 1851.

These 24 hours passes with pleasant weather. Ship lying at anchor. Hands employed in ship duty.

Thursday, Oct. 2^d - Lying at anchor by Pinchgut Island. Getting boats ready for whaling. Lashing spars, &c. One seaman came on board, making 21 men all told.

Friday, Oct. 3^d Strong northerly breeze. At 4 P.M. got under way and beat down to Beach, by head and came to anchor.

Saturday 4th At 9 A.M. got under way, Pilot on board. Light westerly breeze. Before getting out of the heads wind hauled into the Eastward. Beat out during the afternoon. At 6 P.M. home to head- ing East. Sighting heads bearing W. N.W. 35 Miles.

Sunday 5th Strong northerly breezes. Land in sight. Saw several fin-back whale. Sail in sight to the leeward. Took in sail ship heading East.

Monday 6th These 24 hours passes with quick changes of weather. Part of the time heavy winds from Westward. Latter part wind from S. rainy.
