reefed topsails. Sunset took in sail, wore
ship, set quarter watches.

Thursday 9th Light southerly breezes and
calms. Saw one sail and several
fin backs. Hands employ'd in ship
duty. Hove to heading N. N. W.
Lat. by Obs. 34, 37.

Friday 10th These 24 hours passes with mo-
derate breeze from N. E. Saw several
sail and plenty fin-back whale.
Land in sight. Hands employ'd in
ship duty. Hove to on the larboard tack.
Lat. by Obs. 34, 39.

Saturday 11th Passes with southerly gales and
light squalls of rain. Saw a great
show of fin-back whale. Hands
employ'd in ship duty. Hove to
heading E. Lat. by Obs. 35, 25.

Sunday 12th Passes with moderate gale of
wind from S. S. E. Laying to on the
Starboard tack. Lat. 35, 44.

Monday 13th These 24 hours passes with
strong southerly winds. Steering
E. under easy sail. Hands employ'd
in ship duty. Saw nothing.
Lat. by Obs. 35, 54.

Tuesday 14th These 24 hours passes with the
wind from S. and S. W. Steering
E. Hands employ'd in ship duty.
Lat. by Obs. 36, 10
Long. 158, 10

Wednesday 15th These 24 hours light southerly
winds. Saw finbacks. Watches em-
ploy'd in ship duty.
