

Wednesday 29th Passes with pleasant weather. Three things in sight. Saw several humpbacks. Employed in repairing sails. Hove to, heading S.E. Lat. 33, 33. Long. 173, 10

Thursday 30th Passes with light breezes from N.E. Hands employed in ship duty. Hove to, heading N.N.W. Saw plenty of Humpbacks. Three things bearing N. Lat. 34, 12 Long.

Friday 31st Passes with light breezes from E.N.E. Saw nothing. Employed in breaking out main hatch. Hove to, heading S.E. Lat. 34, 02 Long. 171, 55.

Saturday, November 1st This day strong W. B. breeze from N.N.E. At 9 A.M. lowered for sperm whale. Struck and killed one, took him along side and cut him in. Lat. 34, 45

Sunday 2^d Employed in cutting up junk and bailing. Light breeze from N.N.E. Saw humpbacks. Lat. 34, 52. Long. 171, 57.

Monday 3^d Passes with strong breeze from N.N.E. rainy. Employed in bailing. Standing on both Tacks. No observation.

Tuesday 4th Light breeze from N.N.E. with little rain. Finished bailing at 7 P.M. Set quarter trawls. Wind N. heading in shore. Lat. 35, 12 Long. 171, 45

Wednesday 5th Light baffling winds, with little rain. Employ'd in stowing down. Saw nothing. Hove to. Lat. 35, 17. Long. 172, 00

Thursday 6th Light breeze from S.E. Spoke and gamed with the whaling brig Grecian of Hobart Town. Hove to heading N. Lat. 35, 17. Long. 172, 20

Friday 7th Wind put strong wind from S.E. At noon moderated, made sail. Saw land bearing N.E. Steering N.W. all night of 8th. Lat. at noon 34, 33.

Saturday 8th Passes with light breeze from S.E.W. Employed in getting out water and filling up with salt. Hove to on starboard tack. Three things bearing S.W. 25 miles.

Sunday 9th Strong breeze from S.W. Saw no whale. Saw land. Hove to on starboard tack. Lat. 34, 06. Long. 172, 54.
